
Administrator McCarthy:

I write in regards to remediation efforts at the Hopewell Precision superfund site. As you may be aware, nearly 15 years ago authorities confirmed that industrial pollution from Hopewell Precision Inc. had contaminated the groundwater for hundreds of homes and businesses in Hopewell Junction, New York. Recognizing the severity of the problem and the need for action, the EPA placed the site on the National Priorities List in April 2005. The designation was an important step forward, but unfortunately there has been little visible progress in the years since. Hundreds of Hopewell Junction residents still do not have access to a reliable, safe water source.

However, in an important development, the EPA and state and local authorities recently finalized a proposal to connect impacted homes and businesses to a reliable, clean water source. I strongly urge the EPA to move with all available speed and resources to fund that proposal.

The people of Hopewell Junction have waited for too long. After nearly 15 years, this proposal represents a real chance at the long-term solution that they deserve. I thank you for your attention to this issue and look forward to working with you on this.
